

Information on mineral oil residues (Mosh/Moah)

Regarding the questions concerning the printing inks our suppliers use and to what extent those products contain residues of mineral oil -mineral oil saturated hydrocarbons (MOSH) and mineral oil aromatic hydrocarbons (MOAH)- we can state the following:

Quality and safety of our products is one of our highest priorities. We therefore comply with all relevant national and international directives and regulations, especially those under European Law. This is stated in the 'Declaration of Compliance' and of course the BRC- certificate of our supplier. They also comply with all limits regarding migration. This has been stated in the migration-tests of our supplier.

The inks which are used are water-based printing inks, for which the manufacturer confirms their suitability for use in the manufacture of packaging for foodstuffs (without direct contact between the printing inks and those foodstuffs). A statement of the manufacturer of the printing inks regarding the lack of content of heavy metals as well as MOSH MOAH are available.

Our suppliers do not use the substances MOSH and MOAH as constituents in the manufacturing process for the packaging we supply to our customers.

Regarding the present time and the limits that are still not set for the migration and/or content of MOSH and MOAH in recycled paper, we can report you that we are in close contact with our advisers on this field. If there are any updates or developments we will make sure we will meet all guidelines and regulations and we will keep you updated and informed in these matters if necessary.
